

AMC Theater
Conditions for Alcoholic Beverage License

These conditions will be in addition to the Board of Selectmen's Rules and Regulations for the Licensing and Sale of Alcoholic Beverages. These conditions are in place to address the fact that the AMC Theater is not a restaurant with table service and is not required to have a full menu.

- 1) A barrier must be provided separating the service bar area from the main corridor. This barrier must be approved by the Town in advance of serving.
- 2) Alcohol may only be sold from the service bar area as approved by the Town. Alcohol can be consumed in the theaters and main corridor only. Alcohol cannot be taken past the entry doors into the airlock vestibule. All alcohol sold shall be done in cups that are distinctive and easily recognizable by staff and police.
- 3) Identification for each patron consuming alcohol must be electronically checked and registered for each individual drink purchased. A patron may not purchase alcohol for a patron not being scanned at the time of purchase. A patron may only have in their possession one drink at a time. Only two drinks may be sold to any one patron per visit to the location in any one day.
- 4) A manager must be available at any time the service bar is open or liquor is being consumed in the theater to address situations. Whenever the service bar is open or liquor is being consumed in the theater, a staff member shall be assigned to patrol all areas to ensure that all applicable liquor laws are being met. This staff member shall not have any other duties assigned to them. They may assist in seating patrons in the theater as long as this does not interfere with their primary duty of ensuring that all applicable liquor laws are being met. This position will be reviewed by the Town to ensure compliance is being properly enforced and that the goal of preventing underage drinking is achieved.
- 5) Recording cameras shall be installed at the service bar area to record all transactions. This system must be reviewed by the Police Department for location and quality. These recordings shall be made available to the police upon request. These cameras must be approved in advance by the Town.
- 6) Hours that the service bar may serve alcohol are as follows:

Monday thru Thursday	4:00 pm – 12:00 pm	Midnight
Friday thru Sunday	2:00 pm – 12:00 pm	Midnight

All alcohol and their containers must be removed from the theater by 1:00 am the latest. No alcohol may be consumed after that time and must be cleared from the floor. The theater may stay open later as approved by the Town.
- 7) The Theater must develop an alcohol compliance plan and submit that to the Burlington Police Department for approval. At a minimum of six times per year, an outside entity must test the purchasing and ID system of the theater and reports are properly submitted to the Burlington Police Department. The theater shall also be subject to review and testing of the Burlington Police Department.
- 8) When the service bar is not open to the public, all alcohol shall be stored in a secured way so that it cannot be accessed by the public.
