ZONING ARTICLES

ARTICLE 2 RE: Amend Article II - Historically Significant Building or Structure

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Bylaws as follows:

To amend Article II, by amending Section 2.33.2 "Historically Significant Building or Structure" to read as follows:

2.33.2 Historically Significant Building or Structure

"Any building or structure located within the Town which was, in whole or in part, constructed ~~one hundred (100)~~ **seventy-five (75)** or more years prior to the date of application for a demolition permit, and (a) which is listed on or is within an area listed on the National or State Register of Historic Places or is the subject of a pending application for such listing; or (b) which is or has been designated by the Burlington Historical Commission to be a historically significant building or structure, or which the Historical Commission finds to be eligible for such designation, following a finding by the Historical Commission; or (c) which is listed in the Cultural Resources Inventory of the Burlington Master Plan"

ARTICLE 3 RE: Amend Article IX - Notice of Intent to Demolish

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Bylaws as follows:

To amend Article IX, by amending Section 9.1.3.2.1 “Notice of Intent to Demolish” to read as follows:

“No demolition permit shall be issued for any building or structure which was constructed ~~one hundred (100)~~ **seventy-five (75)** or more years prior to the year of application, other than in conformity with the provisions of this Bylaw. An application for a demolition permit shall first be filed by the applicant and/or property owner with the Inspector of Buildings, and a copy of such application shall be forwarded within one (1) week by the Inspector of Buildings to the Historical Commission, the Board of Selectmen, and the Planning Board. Such application shall be in the form provided and established by the Inspector of Buildings and shall include a copy of the demolition plan, a description of the building or structure to be demolished, the reasons for the demolition and the proposed reuse of the property. If the applicant and/or property owner is unable to specify the exact age of the building or structure, the application shall so state and shall set forth the most approximate age known and the basis for such approximation.”

ARTICLE 4

RE: Wireless Communications Facilities- Placement Requirements

To see if the Town will vote to amend Zoning ByLaw Section 4.1.6 - Temporary Partial Moratorium on Personal Wireless Services Facilities - by deleting that entire section as currently written and replacing it with the following Section 4.1.6:

4.1.6 Wireless Communications Facilities - Placement Requirements:

4.1.6.1. Purpose: The purpose of these regulations is to minimize the adverse impacts from the provision of wireless communication services to adjacent areas and residential neighborhoods by minimizing the number and height of associated facilities to only what is necessary and by promoting the sharing of existing or new facilities.

4.1.6.2.1. “Wireless Communication Facility” (WCF) shall mean wireless communication monopoles with antennas, antennas attached to existing structures and associated accessory structures, if any, which facilitate the provision of wireless communication services.

4.1.6.2.2 “Wireless Communication Services” (WCS) shall mean the provision of following types of services: cellular telephone, personal communications and enhanced specialized mobile radio service.

4.1.6.3 General Requirements:

A. WCF's shall be allowed in all zones by special permits. The special permit granting authority for this section shall be the Planning Board. Besides the criteria set out under Section 9.2.0 of this bylaw, any such proposal shall meet the approval criteria set forth under this section.

B. Only free-standing monopoles, with associated antennas and/or panels are allowed for new structure installations. Lattice style towers and similar facilities requiring three or more legs and/or guy wires for support are not permitted to receive wireless communication facilities except those structures that were existing when this bylaw became effective.

C. All structures and/or equipment erected for providing "Wireless Communication Services" shall be removed within two (2) years of cessation of use at the owner's expense.

D. Any proposed extension in the height, addition of cells, antenna, panels or vendors, or construction of a new or replacement of an existing facility shall be subject to a new special permit pursuant to Section 9.2.0 of this bylaw.

4.1.6.4 Application Process:

The applicant shall follow the application process set forth under Section 9.2.0 of this bylaw and to the rules and regulations of the Planning Board and shall submit complete documentation so as to demonstrate compliance with this section.

4.1.6.5. Approval Criteria:

A. For new construction, regardless of the yard setbacks required under this bylaw in the applicable zoning district, monopoles and accessory structures shall be set back from all property lines at least the height of the monopole structure as measured from the base of said structure. There shall be no exception to this provision.

B. For attachment of "Wireless Communication Services" equipment to existing structures, the existing building/structure must meet the height requirement set forth under this bylaw in the applicable zoning district, or meet the height requirements of the bylaw when built (nonconforming building/structure), or receive a variance pursuant to section 9.5.0 of this bylaw if the proposal exceeds the height requirements.

C. No monopole including the antenna attached thereto shall exceed the height requirements set forth under this bylaw in the applicable zoning district.

D. Antennas or panels which are located on non residential buildings/structures shall be mounted so as to be less than 12 feet in height above the roof-line of the building/structure.

E. All monopoles, associated equipment, antennas, buildings, structures and appurtenances shall be painted or treated so as to blend in with the landscape and/or the structure on which they are located.

F. All WFT's shall be sited so as to minimize visibility from abutting streets and nearby buildings and to limit the need to remove existing vegetation.

G. WCF's shall be designed to accommodate as many users as is feasible so as to reduce the number of facilities which will be needed in the surrounding service area.

H. Wireless communication facilities may not be placed within 200 feet of an adjacent residential property, day care and preschool facility or schools. This measurement is taken from the structure and the equipment storage facility.

I. Annual RF emissions monitoring is required for all sites by an independent RF engineer to be hired with the Planning Board approval and at the owner's expense. Test results will be submitted to the Town as soon as available.

4.3.1.14(a) towers and antennas for generation or transmission of signals other than those covered by subsection 4.2.2.24,

ARTICLE 5

RE: Growth Moratorium

To see if the Town will vote to request the Planning Board to develop a proposed amendment to the Zoning Bylaw, to be presented at the September 2000 Town Meeting which would establish a moratorium on the issuance of building permits for all non-residential construction for a two year period, provided that the proposed Zoning Bylaw should contain a procedure to allow exemptions from the moratorium for projects that are beneficial to the Town such as remediation of environmentally damaged areas, the purpose of such a bylaw would be to allow the Town a two year period to conduct a review of the Zoning Bylaws as needed and to review potential infrastructure issues such as roads, water supply, sewers, and the impact of additional growth on Town services such as police, fire, DPW, and schools, or to act in any other manner in relation thereto.

**ARTICLE 6
Bylaw**

RE: Amend Article X111 - Amusement Devices

To see if the Town will vote to amend Article X111, Section 1.0 by adding a new section 1.38 Automatic Amusement Devices to read as follows:

“In accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 140, Section 177A, as amended from time to time, any individual or business desiring to keep and operate an automatic amusement device for hire, gain or reward, shall secure an annual license from the Board of Selectmen. The Board of Selectmen shall not grant a license for any automatic amusement device which presents a risk of misuse as game devices. Automatic amusement devices which present a risk of misuse as gaming devices are those devices which have one or more of the following features: (1) the device involves matching random number, patterns or cards; (2) the device may not accumulate more than twenty-six (26) plays; (3) the device may not be equipped with a “knock off” switch, button or similar device; (4) the device shall have no mechanism for adjusting the odds; (5) the device shall not have a remote control feature that can reset the device from another location; (6) the device shall not be capable of returning money to the player, other than the change for the excess amount put in; (7) the device shall not permit a player to pay for more than one game at a time; (8) each game on the device shall cost exactly the same amount for each player and no player may change any aspect of the game by paying a different amount than any other player before or during the game; (9) there shall be no metering device that accounts for both money/points in and money/points out. The maximum number of automatic amusement devices allowed on any single business premises shall be four (4), except in the case of duly licensed arcades and amusement parks. Any individual or business desiring more than four (4) automatic amusement devices on a single business premises shall require a special permit from the Board of Appeals. All licenses for automatic amusement devices granted by the Board of Selectmen shall be subject to inspection by the Burlington Police Department to insure conformance with submitted application information and local ordinance requirements. Any unlicensed automatic amusement device shall be subject to immediate seizure by the Burlington Police Department”

GENERAL BYLAW ARTICLES

ARTICLE 7 RE: Amend Reference to Riverfront and Definition of Riverfront

To see if the Town will vote to amend Burlington By-law Article XIV, Section 1.1 “No person shall remove, fill, dredge, build upon or alter any bank, freshwater wetland, marsh, bog, wet meadow, swamp, creek, river, stream, pond, or lake or any land under such waters, or any land bordering thereon as hereinafter defined, or any land subject to flooding or inundation.....” to read: “No person shall remove, fill, dredge, build upon or alter any bank, freshwater wetland, marsh, bog, wet meadow, swamp, creek, river, stream, pond, or lake or any land under such waters, or any land bordering thereon as hereinafter defined, or any land subject to flooding or inundation, riverfront area.....”; and to amend Section 1.2 Public Hearings by adding: 1.2.4 “Permits shall expire three (3) years from the date of issuance. An applicant may apply for an extension at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the expiration of the permit or extension and the Commission may grant extensions for one (1) or more periods of up to three (3) years each. Notice of any extensions of time granted an applicant shall be filed with the Town Clerk;”

and further amend Burlington By-law Article XIV Section 1.7 Definitions by adding a new section 1.7.9: "Riverfront area" shall mean: that area of land situated between a perennial stream's mean annual high-water line and a parallel line located a maximum of 200 feet away, measured outward horizontally from the stream's mean annual high-water line. The Commission may, after a public hearing, designate a riverfront area of less than 200 feet for a densely developed area. This definition shall not create a buffer zone, so-called, beyond such riverfront area. The riverfront area shall not include land now or formerly associated with historic mill complexes in existence prior to nineteen hundred and forty-six and situated landward of the waterside facade of a retaining wall, building, sluiceway, or other structure existing on the effective date of this By-law. The riverfront area shall not apply to any mosquito control work done under the provisions of clause (36) of MGL Chap. 40, Sec. 5, of MGL Chapters 200 and 52 or of any special act, and to construction, expansion, repair, maintenance or other work on piers, docks, wharves, boat houses, coastal engineering structures, landings, and all other structures and activities subject to licensing or permitting under MGL Chapter 91 and its regulations; provided that such structures and activities shall remain subject to statutory and regulatory requirements under MGL Chap. 91 and MGL Chap. 100 Sec. 40 and MGL Chap. 31 or at the site of any project authorized by special act prior to January 1, 1973." or to act in any other manner in relation thereto.

TOWN COUNSEL'S OPINION
