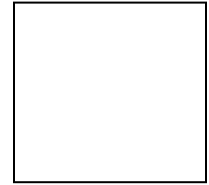
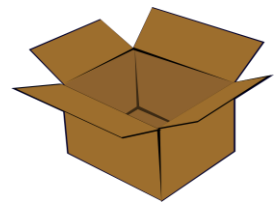

Please Save this Guide.

Enclosed please find the 2018/2019 Automated Single Stream Recycling and Trash Collection Guide. It covers from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. Also included in the guide is information on yard waste, disposal of bulky waste, appliances, TV's and Computer Monitors (CRT's), and construction and demolition debris (C&D). Please note that starting July 1st 2018 there will be a fee charged for all white goods pickup on things such as TV's, computers, appliances, tires, metal items, etc. Please find the schedule of charges enclosed in this guide.

To report that the truck missed a pickup of trash and/or recycling please call the DPW at 781-270-1670 or Republic Services at 800-442-9006. **Please call by noon on the day following your pick up day to schedule a missed pick up**, otherwise it will have to be held until the following week.

Yard waste pickup follows a Monday through Friday schedule. Therefore your yard waste pickup day may not be on Thursday. Please have it to the curb by 7:00 am. Requirements for yard waste are:

“Must be tied and bundle. Tree Branches cannot be larger than 4” in diameter. Bundles cannot be larger than 30” in diameter, and must be no larger than 3 foot in length. Barrels/Bags cannot be heavier than 50 lbs.”

Christmas Tree Pickup will follow the “yard waste” schedule and will be for **ONE WEEK ONLY** starting on **January 15th**. Please call 781-270-1670 if you do not know your yard waste day (Mon thru Fri pickup except Holidays). Christmas trees should be cut in half if over 6 ft. If you are missed please call the DPW as soon as it's missed so that we can have it picked up.

Bulk Items: NO FEE at this time. Bulk items can safely be disposed as trash but they are too large to fit in the trash cart. **A limit of 4 items** will be picked up per week. Examples of bulk include:

How to Recycle in Burlington



MATERIAL	WHAT TO RECYCLE	HOW TO PREPARE	NOT ALLOWED/ NOT RECYCLABLE IN BURLINGTON (by our Trash Hauler)
METAL	-Steel/tin/aluminum -Cans/plates/trays -Latex paint cans only	-Rinse clean -Labels OK -Let them dry out	<u>DO NOT RECYCLE:</u> - Oil paint cans (HHHW) - Batteries/aerosol Cans - Metal items/car parts - Coat hangers
GLASS	-Clear and colored Beverage containers only	-Rinse clean -Collar/neck rings/labels OK	<u>DO NOT RECYCLE:</u> - Broken glass/auto glass - Mirrors - Ceramics (plate/cookware) - Drinking glasses - Light bulbs - Windows
PLASTIC	-All Plastics labeled #1 thru #7 EXCEPT THE FOLLOWING: Styrofoam and Plastic Bags which are not allowed by the Trash Hauler	-Rinse clean -Crush/Flatten to conserve Space -Labels OK	<u>DO NOT RECYCLE:</u> - STYROFOAM - Aseptic (sterile) cartons - Chemical/motor oil containers - Toys - PLASTIC BAGS – can be recycled at grocery stores
CARDBOARD	ALL Cardboard is mandatory to recycle. It will NOT be accepted in the trash! There is a cardboard dumpster located behind Town Hall for any overflow you may have.	Breakdown, flatten or fold boxes, cartons & other pieces of cardboard into size that fits into the green toter.	<u>DO NOT RECYCLE:</u> - Contaminated Boxes - Pizza Boxes
PAPER	-Newspapers -Magazines/catalogs -Junk mail, envelopes -Books (remove hardcovers) -Paper bags -Phone books -Office/computer paper -Boxboard (cereal/cracker – remove liner)	-Remove cover on hardcover books -Remove liner from cereal/cracker boxes	<u>DO NOT RECYCLE:</u> - Food-soiled paper/boxes - Paper towels, tissues, napkins (this is considered trash) - Disposable diapers (trash) - Frozen-food boxes - NO PIZZA BOXES

ALL RECYCLABLES CAN BE MIXED TOGETHER IN THE GREEN RECYCLING TOTER – SINGLE STREAM!

HOLIDAYS are shown in **Bold Face Type**. Any scheduled collection day following a holiday will be collected one day later.

XMAS Tree Collection will be week of 1/15/19 thru 1/19/19 **ONLY - on your Yard Waste pickup day - not sure which day is yours**
Please call us. **YARD WASTE** and **XMAS TREES** follow a Mon thru Fri pickup and is designated by the **SHADED** area.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE will be collected on **9/22/18** and **TBD**
 (marked in **BLUE** on the calendar). For more information please contact the

BURLINGTON TRASH BAGS

Burlington “**Overflow**” bags are used when you can’t fit all your trash in the **blue** trash toter. They can be purchased at all the major grocery stores or at the Town offices. You must pay for them in the Tax Office (Main Town Hall) and pick up your bags in the DPW Office (Town Hall Annex).

The bags are used “outside” of the trash toter.
Cost: 5 bags/\$10

APPLIANCE PICK-UP & BULKY ITEMS

YOU must call Republic Services at 1-800-442-9006 to schedule a pick-up for any bulky trash items that do not fit in the blue trash toter, such as couch, table, chair

There is a nominal charge for TV’s/CRT’s/Computers and Appliances (see schedule)

YARD WASTE/LEAVES ONLY

July 23 - July 27, 2018*
August 27 - August 31, 2018*
September 24 - September 28, 2018*
October 15 - November 30, 2018*
April 16 - May 24, 2019*
June 24 - June 28, 2019*
Yard waste must be out by 7:00 am
***ON YOUR YARD WASTE PICK UP DAY**

Week of January 14, 2019
(1/15 thru 1/19)

ON YOUR YARD WASTE PICKUP DAY

Trees must be free of decorations and stands.
Trees in bags will NOT be picked up!
Trees must be out by 7:00 am

****ANY TREE LARGER THAN 6 FEET MUST BE CUT IN HALF****

****** NO PLASTIC BAGS******

CARDBOARD

Cardboard boxes should be broken down and placed in the wheeled **green** recycle toter for pick up.

For your convenience, there are two cardboard dumpsters located behind Town Hall. Please flatten ALL cardboard. If the dumpster is full please do not leave it on the outside of the dumpster. This dumpster is emptied every Monday. Please return after it’s emptied to put your flattened cardboard in.

CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS (C&D) NOT ALLOWED IN TRASH

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection bans the disposal of C&D materials with regular trash. Disposal of C&D from household building or renovation projects is the homeowner’s responsibility. Debris includes treated and untreated wood, toilets, sinks, windows, doors, brick, concrete, asphalt and similar items. Residents must contact a licensed C&D disposal company. Consider donating reusable building material to a non-profit such as Habitat for Humanity.
