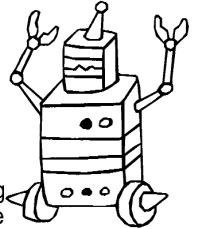

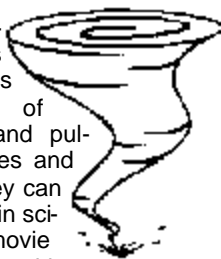
NEW IT'S ALL GREEK TO ME VACATION CLUB
